Dear Parents and Students of Year 13

A Level Results Day - Thursday, 13 August 2026

We are looking forward to welcoming our students back to receive their A Level and Vocational results and celebrate and support accordingly.

Please see below details of the arrangements for collecting results, together with answers to frequently asked questions:

Where do I pick up my results?

Access to the school will be via Reception. On arrival, you will be signposted to Saint Benedict Block where results will be issued.

What time can I pick up my results?

The school will be open from **8.00am – 10:30am**.

How will I know if I have secured my place at university?

Universities will have already received your results by 8am (if not sooner) and will update your offer via **'Track'**.

What will "Track" show? If decisions have been made, you can expect to see the following changes to offers on your Track:

- Unconditional - your place on the course has been confirmed. This may be your firm or insurance offer (depending on your grades etc). The university will get in touch with you.
- Unconditional Changed Course (UCC) - you do not have the necessary grades for your offer, but the university has proposed a similar course requiring lower grades. They may also offer an alternative start date, such as deferred entry. You have five days to decide and can discuss the opportunity with the university in question.
- Unsuccessful - you have not been accepted by your choice(s). You are now eligible to enter Clearing and will receive a 'Clearing Number' - you will need this so make a note.



What if I get better grades than I expected?

If you managed to meet and exceed the conditions of your firm offer, and you are happy with that then that is great. However, if you would like to explore the possibility of picking an alternative course requiring higher grades you can do so, but do not reject your offer without securing an alternative (and talking to Miss Garcha or Ms Duffy)

What if I do not get the grades I need and have been placed into Clearing.

Should you need additional support at this time, we will work students and families to ensure that every student receives guidance to progress to the next stage of their education, employment, or training. On the day, there will be members of staff, including our UCAS advisors to give any necessary support or guidance that is needed. In this situation, having all the essential information to hand will prove useful when applying for a place through Clearing.

- a fully charged mobile phone (and charger) a notepad and pen
- university contact numbers, your UCAS Track number, universities' UCAS and Clearing numbers
- notes from having researched universities and courses beforehand, with a list of questions to ask course tutors
- your personal statement and GCSE results

If any changes to the above arrangements are necessary, the school will issue updated plans via email and social media.
