



BOOM READER



Boomreader is an online method of recording all the reading that your child completes both in school and at home. It replaces the traditional paper version - and because it is online it can't be lost, forgotten or eaten by the dog! You can log in from any internet enabled device.



The online reading record enables schools and home to work together to progress a child's reading and it allows us to maintain a record from reception through to Year 6 rather than replace a reading record each



<u>JOURNEY</u>

Pupils will come to school on Thursday with their luggage. We are the second pick up of the day (St Greg's School will be collected first) and the bus is due between 1.45 - 2.00pm. Parents are welcome to wave students off from Simon Stone Street.

**IMPORTANT - Travel sickness tablets. If your child has ever suffered with travel sickness it is important that they have medication that day for the journey. Please give to the office /staff on the door with a medication form filled out (available from the office).

It is important that medication for the journey home is also given in.

There will be a stop at Telford services where pupils will use the toilet and have a drink and biscuit. (we will be fed when we arrive) The second part of the journey is very windy along Welsh mountain roads.

No books for the journey as reading can cause travel sickness. Pupils will be asked to remove hoodies so they do not over heat on the journey and there are to be no hats or caps.

When we arrive it is likely to be dark. Pupils can pupils bring a torch for the walk down the unlit country lane.

ITEMS TO BE LEFT AT HOME

For health and safety reasons you must NOT bring - Any mains electrical equipment including hairdryers, music players, kettles, plug in razors, irons, heaters, mobile phone chargers etc.

The Centre can provide hairdryers.

Chewing gum / Food supplies - The Centre provides all food

Any medicine (including painkillers like paracetamol). Medication form filled in and handed into the office. Please speak to a member of staff

Mobile phones should not be brought, they are unnecessary, disruptive, unsafe and could hinder an emergency (Dol-y-Moch staff carry mobile phones). The Centre has a strict code of use for mobile phones and reserves the right to confiscate phones and return them to parents

Activities

- Kayaking / Canoeing The Centre has 4 fleets of boats. Some are single seat kayaks and some are open boats that can carry more than one person. We mostly use these on the small centre lake or on a slow flowing river. Sometimes the kayaks are used on the sea. Children always wear buoyancy aids, and if appropriate helmets.
- Climbing / Abseiling the centre has a small climbing wall and uses nearby rock slabs with a range of routes. Children are safeguarded by ropes, harnesses and helmets.
- Forge Activity this involves group challenges in a steep sided river valley. This involves scrambling over rocks, along ledges and crossing the river. The water is generally shallow and children are issued with helmets, boots and if appropriate, harnesses.
- Mountain Journey a journey on foot through one of the mountain ranges in Snowdonia National Park. Usually involves reaching a summit and scrambling over rocky terrain.
- Mine Adventure involves going underground into a disused mine, that has been inspected under a scheme approved by the Health and Safety Executive. Inside, mines are often spacious caverns which can be reached by straightforward walking, sometimes scrambling over rocks or wading through water. Children are issued with helmets, lamp and protected by rope and harness if appropriate.
- Orienteering / Children find their way, in small groups, using Wayfinding maps, through local woodlands with adult supervision.
