





BOOM READER



Boomreader is an online method of recording all the reading that your child completes both in school and at home. It replaces the traditional paper version - and because it is online it can't be lost, forgotten or eaten by the dog! You can log in from any internet enabled device.



The online reading record enables school and home to work together to progress a child's reading level, and it allows us to maintain a record from reception through to Year 6 rather than replace a reading record each year.
